Introduction

The Higher Population Council (HPC) is pleased to present its annual achievements report for the year 2022, founded on its strategic objectives in achieving sustainable and equitable growth based on planning from the perspective of the National Population Strategy (2021-2030); promoting gender equality; women's empowerment and reproductive health & rights within the human rights system and with a gender approach based on the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) 1994. As part of the achievement of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the commitments of the Nairobi Summit 2019. HPC has, since its establishment, provided a clear vision on how demographic variables can be integrated into development planning, where demographic dynamics (births, deaths, migration), and associated outputs (population structure and distribution) affect all aspects of human life including the environment, as there is no sector with no demographic dimension.

During 2022, HPC focused primarily on:

- Demographic and Development Issues, especially in the field of integrating population dynamics into the development and gender planning process.
- Drafting the National Population Strategy executive plan (2021-2030), the executive plan of the National Strategy for Reproductive and Sexual Health (2022-2024), and the integration of the National Plan to fulfill Jordan's commitments to the Nairobi Summit (2021-2030) into the two executive plans of the two strategies (population, reproductive and sexual health).
- Launching and implementing the activities of the communication strategy for sexual and reproductive health issues for the Share-Net platform (2022-2024).
- Executing and participating in educational sessions on the Project Improvement Model Program using the participatory approach of the Share-Net International Rapid Improvement Model (SHIRIM) platform.
- Attending and participating in the third conference of Share-Net International held in Colombia, July 2022.

HPC participated in many events and meetings organized by the Arab Council for Population and Development to discuss ways to address the population and development challenges facing the Arab countries, including the participation in the meeting of the fourth session of the Arab Council for Population and Development.

In 2022, HPC finalized many studies and summaries of policies and strategies related to demographic and developmental issues, which by implementing its recommendations and contents will contribute to addressing the challenges related to these issues.

HPC completed many capacity-building programs for partners and stakeholders from various national bodies to support the achievement and implementation of strategies and objectives of international conferences, including the goals of the International Conference on Population and Development.

Within the framework of the HPC's interest in raising awareness and advocating for demographic and development issues, the electronic knowledge platform for reproductive health for young people 'DARBY' was launched; the platform aims to raise awareness among community members, especially young men and women, and improve their reproductive health by providing an all-inclusive package of information and data.

HPC carried out a number of media products, such as a theatrical play, "What are you waiting for", to enhance youth orientation towards entrepreneurship and self-employment in the governorates within three regions; multiple media and promotional materials and videos; capacity building of media professionals; formation of the HPC media team with media professionals from various media outlets, in addition to enhancing the role of the media to support population and development issues as well as participating in various local events organized by national partners. In order to provide an environment sensitive to the population dimension and gender, HPC worked during 2021 and 2022 with selected municipalities to reflect the population dimension in their local plans, build the capacity and qualify selected associations to provide a youth-friendly environment to reproductive health issues.

The Higher Population Council's significant achievements were the result of adopting an integrated and holistic approach based on investing in individual capacities, human rights, and a gender perspective as a basis for achieving sustainable development, facilitating access to health services and ensuring their quality.

Despite these achievements, there are still many challenges facing the population and development questions, including the delicate integration of the population dimension in the national and local planning process; the difficulty of providing comprehensive and complete data and indicators at the subnational level; the growing proportions of the population of youth age groups at rates that exceed economic growth rates; the unbalanced geographical distribution of the population that is harmful to sustainable development; the high unemployment rates, especially among young people; the low levels of women's economic participation, the weak environment for sexual and reproductive health services provided to youth and people with disabilities; in addition to the question of seeking asylum and its impact on Jordan socially and economically; and the impact of regional crises, which require concerted national efforts in all forms to confront.

In conclusion, I would like to express my sincere thanks and appreciation to Her Royal Highness Princess Basma Bint Talal, UNFPA's Goodwill Ambassador, for her active and direct role in supporting HPC. Acknowledgement goes to everyone who contributed in supporting the Higher Population Council, especially Her Excellency the Minister of Planning and International Cooperation, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Higher Population Council, their excellences the distinguished members, partners and donors internationally, regionally and locally.

Gratitude also to the HPC team for their sincere and distinguished efforts. We look forward to achieving more successes and development.

The Higher Population Council is the national reference body for all demographic issues and information related to development through proposing of policies, strategies and action plans on population and development, following up and evaluating their implementation, advocating and raising awareness, and strengthening national capacities in this field in coordination with partners and stakeholders to achieve sustainable development. HPC directs its effort to the following areas:

- Population and Development: Focuses on achieving sustainable and equitable growth based on planning from the perspective of the National Population Strategy (2021-2030) and the demographic opportunity policies and mobilizing efforts to make the most of the demographic opportunity.
- Reproductive Health and Rights: Focuses on supporting reproductive health rights and reproductive rights within the human rights framework, by increasing access to high-quality reproductive health services based on the International Conference on Population and Develop ment Programme 1994, the Sustainable Development Goals 2030 and the Nairobi Summit 2019.
- Forced migrations and asylum seekers, issues of the youth, women's empowerment and senior citizens.

Challenges

Challenges at the institutional level of the Higher Population Council

Challenges at the level of Population and Development:

- Lack of population and development experts and demographers.
- Population distribution is unbalanced and detrimental to sustainable development.
- Difference in demographic changes and components among refugees affected the demographic change in the age structure of the population.
- The problem of Syrian refugees and the extent of its impact on Jordan socially and economically, which resulted in updating all population documents HPC is working on, such as the National Population Strategy (2021-2030) and the National Strategy for Reproductive and Sexual Health (2020-2030).
- Lack of attention to the demographic dimension during the preparation phases of local plans.
- The highest percentage of municipal budgets goes to capital projects while development projects that take into account the population dimension and gender rank lowest.
- The budgets of ministries and institutions do not address the population dimension.
- Reduced funding by parties concerned with refugee programmes on population, development, and reproductive health issues.

Challenges at the level of reproductive health:

- A gap between institutional interventions and strategic interventions of the National Strategy for Reproductive and Sexual Health (2020-2030).
- Some indicators on the level of results and outputs of the National Strategy for Reproductive and Sexual Health for the years (2020-2030) are not available (base values, target values), which hinders the preparation of achievement reports and follow-up.

Challenges at the national level

Challenges at the level of population and development:

- Population Size has increased to reach (11.3) million people, six million of which were added in the past two decades.
- Refugees have added demographic, economic, social and administrative burdens on all national structures.
- The uneven distribution of the population and the concentration of the population in the governorates of the center and north of the Kingdom and the high growth rate of major cities generate many problems represented in the loss of cultivated land, high cost of housing, traffic problems and congestion, great pressure on fundamental services and infrastructure, and a threat to environmental sustainability.
- The slowdown in the pace of economic growth and the Jordanian economy's inability to take in the growing numbers of entrants to the labour market and high unemployment rates.
- The need for a change in the education system and its outputs and for a holistic human development that takes into account quantity, quality and compatibility with the requirements of the labor market.
- Stability and even decline in the rates of women's economic participation.
- Increase in the percentage of expatriate workers in the work force.
- Lack of an accountability framework in the implementation of strategic interventions.

Challenges at the level of reproductive health:

- Lack of the sexual and reproductive health information and services to all groups, especially adolescents, youth, persons with disabilities and the elderly.
- Quick move to having a first child and lack of prospects for premarital counseling.
- Continue to bear children until a male child is born.
- The rise in the proportion of children under 15 and under 18 years of age creates a driving force for the increase in the number of girls at child bearing age, and a yearly increase in the number of births, with at least one million births registered every five years.

- High increase in the percentage of caesarean section births.
- Short period of breastfeeding in Jordan.
- An increase in gender-based violence and some cases have advanced into killings within the family.
- The rate of girls marriage under the age of 18 years for the past seven years exceeded 15%.
- Occurrence of divorce at an early age, as 58% of divorced women are under 30 years of age.

HPC Achievements 2022




The Higher Population Council's work focuses on strengthening the capacity of government institutions, the private sector, civil society organizations and relevant institutions in supporting the implementation of the International Conference on Population and Development agenda 1994, and in particular with regard to reproductive health and gender issues, with a focus on improving the health and well-being of women, adolescents, youth, persons with disabilities and the elderly, as well as supporting the implementation of sustainable development goals agenda, which are in line with the national strategies and commitments of the Nairobi Summit 2019.

HPC identified its points of intervention through the theory of change at three levels:

The Enabling Environment Level is

determined by the viable legal and policy frame works based on the programme of action of the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) as part of the achievement of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the Nairobi Summit 2019, within the human rights scheme to attain sustainable and equitable growth based on planning to



realize the outcomes and results of the National Population Strategy for the years (2021-2030) and population opportunity policies: respond to the dimensions of forced and voluntary migrations and displacement: promote gender equality and women's empowerment by integrating population

dynamics into the macro, sectoral, local and national planning process; and develop accountability and monitoring mechanisms based on the analysis of gender-sensitive data and indicators and generate knowledge on challenges and available opportunities.

- The Institutional Level focuses on developing the capacity of national governmental institutions and others to be able to plan from the perspective of the demographic opportunity policies so that legal frameworks and policies maintain a practical content.
- The Individual and Community Level focuses on harnessing all forms of media and advocacy
 channels to support cultural practices that promote population and development issues, gender
 equality, and the principle of justice and equal opportunities; this is a long-term process and uses
 a participatory approach, changes in behavioral communication, and capacity building programs.




Studies, Policy Briefs and Fact Sheets to Support Policy-making and Decision-Makers

Launch the results of the study, "The Connection between Mental Health and Maternal Health on Childbirth among Married Syrian Refugee Women under the age of 18 Years"

On 3/8/2022, HPC launched the results of the study" The Connection between Mental Health and Maternal Health on Child birth among Married Syrian Refugee Women Under the Age of 18 years, with the participation of the relevant national authorities.

The study, prepared by HPC in cooperation with the University of Jordan, the University of Edinburgh-Scotland and the University of the West of Scotland, and with the support of the Arab Council for Social Sciences under the umbrella of Health and Livelihoods in the Arab Region: Well-being, Fragility and Conflict Program in its first session (2020-2022),



and funded by the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (SIDA), aimed to recognize the perspectives of adolescent girls and Syrian mothers regarding their experiences with child marriage in the context of conflict and displacement, and to explore the motives that increase the exposure and vulnerability of young women married at an early age to sexual and reproductive health abuse and gender-based violence.

Preparing a study and policy brief entitled "Women's withdrawal from the labor market and sexual and reproductive health in light of the ramifications of the COVID-19 crisis"

The Higher Population Council prepared a study and a policy brief entitled women's withdrawal from the labor market and sexual and reproductive health in light of the ramifications of

the COVID-19 crisis funded by SHARE-NET International. Results of the study were launched on 2/6/2022 and the most prominent objectives of which are :


- Examine the demographic, social and economic features of male and female workers and those who withdraw from the labor market according to data derived from the Social Security Corporation.
- Recognize women's participation and withdrawal from the labor market, the types of jobs women are employed in and from which they withdraw, and the gender gap in this field.
- Identify the characteristics of those who receive the one-payment compensation package from data of the Social Security Corporation and the reasons for this option.
- Explore the experience of women withdrawing from a labor market that gives them flexible work hours.
- Find out the reasons why women withdraw from the labor market and the relation of these causes to their sexual and reproductive health.

Launch the results of two specialized studies in the field of sexual and reproductive health

On 1/6/2022, Share-Net Jordan and the Higher Population Council launched the results of two specialized studies in the field of sexual and reproductive health during a meeting held under the auspices of Acting Secretary General for Primary Health Care and Epidemiology / Ministry of Health, and Director of Primary Health Care Administration at the Ministry, with the participation of representatives of official and civil institutions, civil society institutions and international bodies.

1. The studies was: The Impact of Socio-Economic Factors and Gender Dynamics on Sexual and Reproductive Health of Women and Girls in Jerash Governorate.





2. Sexual and Reproductive Health of the Elderly in Jordan

dealt with several topics on the health of the elderly, namely:

- Availability of information and services on the reproductive and sexual health of the elderly.
- Marital status of the elderly, especially with a high percentage of women widows amongst them.
- Chronic non-communicable diseases and their link to the reproductive and sexual health of the elderly.



- Functional difficulties, i.e. disabilities amongst the elderly and their association to reproductive and sexual health.
- Types of cancers related to reproductive health.
- Mortality pattern among the elderly.
- Reproductive infertility.
- Domestic violence directed at the elderly as a vulnerable group.
- Availability of health insurance that guarantees the elderly have access to reproductive health care.



Success story of applying national criteria for youth-friendly sexual and reproductive health services

HPC prepared and designed the success story when national standards for youth-friendly sexual and reproductive health services were put into practice. The story addressed cooperation between the Higher Population Council and the Institute for Family Health Care / King Hussein Foundation by applying the standards in the centers in East Amman, Quwaismah, Zarqa, Karak, and Sweileh that are affiliated to the Institute for Family Health Care, and the extent of success that has been achieved based on the activities implemented in these centers. Both teams recognized the impor-



tance of building a leading national model that offers youth-friendly sexual and reproductive health services compatible to national standards and be an example for other institutions. Accordingly, the two parties signed a cooperation agreement to practice and implement the standards. The story also included a case study of a number of young men and women who frequent the East Amman Center / Al-Quwaismah; the study dealt with the sexual and reproductive health services these young men and women are offered at the center, and the extent to which the level of these services has improved as well as the extent to which they meet the needs of the youth.



The document, which was prepared by HPC with the support of UNFPA / Jordan Office and in a participatory approach with national stakeholders, includes the conceptual framework adopted for the development of the document, and also contains Jordan's international commitments, including the outcomes of the Beijing Conference, the outcomes of the World Population Conference, the Global Agenda for Sustainable Development, the current situation of Jordan's population, and the dialogues that have taken place with stakeholders, as well as other strategies that have been released in this regard.



HPC also prepared a monitoring and evaluation report on the performance of the National Strategy for Reproductive and Sexual Health for the years (2020-2021).

Communication Strategy



The Higher Population Council, with the participation of relevant national authorities and Share-Net Jordan celebrated the launching of the communication strategy for sexual and reproductive health issues for the years (2022-2024) on 31/3/2022.

The strategy aimed to improve internal and external communication in a way to achieve the vision and mission of Share-Net Jordan, provide knowledge on sexual and reproductive health to researchers, research bodies, decision-makers, policy makers,



media, program developers and service providers, in addition, to disseminate and share knowledge on sexual and reproductive health, and support the decision-making process on sexual and reproductive health.

'Shared Creativity: Interpreting Knowledge Together', held in Colombia, July 2022, and organized by Share-Net International and Share-Net Colombia entitled access to quality information on sexual and reproductive health and reproductive rights (technologies, accessibility, interpretation of knowledge, and new challenges such as combating mis-information.

Exhibition of knowledge products in the field of sexual and reproductive health

On the sidelines of the annual meeting of Share-Net Jordan for the year 2022, members of HPC and Share-Net Jordan held an exhibition of knowledge products in the field of sexual and reproductive health, where studies, films, brochures, promotional materials, etc. of partner institutions working in this field



were presented for the purpose of exchanging experiences and best practices.

Participation in the Third World Conference of Share-Net International

Share-Net Jordan participated as part of a Jordanian delegation in the Third Conference of Share-Net International 'Shared Creativity: Interpreting Knowledge Together', held in Colombia

5-7/7/2022, and organized by Share-Net International and Share-Net Colombia, entitled "Access to quality information on sexual and reproductive health and reproductive rights (technologies, accessibility, interpretation of knowledge, and new challenges such as combating misinformation).



The delegation included representatives of Share-Net Jordan, hosted by the Higher Population Council, the Higher Council for the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, the Royal Health

Awareness Society, a representative of the youth sector, as well as several institutions who participated in this conference via visual communication technology 'Zoom.'

The conference aimed to provide the most up-to-date knowledge and evidence on how to access quality information on reproductive health and rights, identify areas that require change, the type of knowledge products and processes needed to improve policies and programs, develop knowledge products and outputs in partnership with content experts and specialists in various media channels, analyze and formulate messages and language used in knowledge products, verify accessibility of the target audience, and work to launch small grants from Share-Net International that focused on realizing these knowledge products, creating an opportunity for learning, exchanging and communicating among international active bodies on sexual and reproductive health.

Share-Net Jordan participation in the first, second and third educational sessions with Share-Net International within the project improvement model using the participatory approach (SHIRIM)

These meetings come as part of a series of educational sessions on participatory approach model, SHIRIM for a duration of 18-months to explore, experience and share effective strategies with members in the seven countries of Share-Net International network (Jordan, Netherlands, Burkina Faso, Bangladesh, Burundi, Colombia and Ethiopia) and to interpret newly acquired knowledge on sexual and reproductive health information and education, with the aim of positively influencing policies and improving the practice. Educational sessions rely primarily on the participatory approach in addition to systematic reflection, contribute to bridging the gap between knowledge and practice by creating a structure in which interested parties can easily learn from one another and from accomplished experts in the subject areas in which they want to improve.

During this process, countries in the Share-Net International network select a topic to work on. Within this approach, Share-Net Jordan) will work on the 'Relationship of parents with their young siblings in regard to sexual and reproductive health education and information.'

Share-Net International organized three virtual educational sessions during February, May and October 2022.

The first session, addressed several topics, including: identifying what knowledge interpretation is,

what tools for improvement and visualization of data that can be used during implementation are, as well as assessing readiness for change.

The Second Session addressed sensitive issues within difficult contexts, how to engage the local team in creating the knowledge product, employing it in their policies and practices, and building the capacity of participants.

The Third Session, held in the Netherlands, dealt with working on team building and clarifying the role of values as fundamental pillars to our systems.



Meeting with the Ambassador of the Kingdom of the Netherlands in Jordan and Consultant for Cooperation Policy in the Field of Human Rights and Gender

HPC held a meeting between Secretary-General of HPC, the Ambassador of the Kingdom of the Netherlands, Mr. Harry Verweij and Consultant for Cooperation Development Policy on Human Rights and Gender.

During a meeting in Amman on 8/12/2022, aspects of cooperation and coordination between the Higher Population Council and the Embassy of the Kingdom of the Netherlands in Amman were discussed; the coordinator of Share-Net Jordan presented the most important achievements of Share-Net Jordan and the annual plan for 2023 and also reviewed Share-Net Jordan's operations at the regional level, and the possibilities of working more together on sexual and reproductive health / human rights.

Participation in the First International Conference on the Impact of Climate Change on the Health Sector

HPC and Share-Net Jordan participated in the first international conference on the impact of climate change on the health sector, which was organized by Al Awn Jordanian-International Health Society in cooperation with the Ministry of Health on 7/6/2022. The conference aimed to gauge the impact of climate change on the health sector as well as the impact of the health sector on climate change in order to achieve the following sub-objectives:

- Support mobilization and steps taken by Jordan to confront climate change, and highlight the fact that the effects of change are transitory across borders.
- Transfer the experiences of neighboring and distant countries in addressing climate change.
- Review government actions and procedures relevant to climate change in neighboring countries.
- Raise public awareness on the danger of climate change and the importance of cooperation to confront it.
- Review and discuss the working papers of the participating experts.

Follow-up to the implementation of the Arab Council for Population and Development Action Plan for 2022

Meeting of the Executive Office of the Arab Council for Population and Development

On 21/7/2022, Secretary-General of the Higher Population Council and Chairman of the Executive Office of the Arab Council for Population and Development chaired the meeting of members of the Executive Office/ Arab Council for Population and Development representing the national population councils



and committees in UAE, Bahrain, Tunisia, Algeria, and Saudi Arabia held via visual communication technology, to:

- Follow up on the implementation of the decisions of the third ordinary session of the Arab
 Council for Population and Development.
- Enhance the integration of population issues and dynamics as an effective factor in national policies, strategies and action plans and in regional development programs and projects.
- Support people working on population issues on the use of modern software.
- Build the capacity of national population councils and committees in the field of reproductive health, social risks and ways to confront them.

Participation in the Fourth Meeting of the Advisory Committee / The Arab Council for Population and Development

The Higher Population Council participated in the fourth meeting of the Advisory Committee/ Arab Council for Population and Development, via video conference on 24/11/2022. The meeting came within the agenda of preparing for the implementation of the fourth ordinary session of the Arab Council and aimed to discuss the proposal of the action plan of the Arab Council for Population and Development during its fourth ordinary session in preparation for endorsement and approval at the meeting of the Arab Council fourth session in Riyadh on 22/12/2022.

Meeting of the fourth session of the Arab Council for Population and Development

The Higher Population Council participated in the meeting of the fourth session of the Arab Council for Population and Development, which was organized by the League of Arab States in cooperation with the Ministry of Economy in Riyadh-Kingdom of Saudi Arabia on 22/12/2022. During the meeting, several items related to the action plan of the Arab Council for Population and Development in its fourth ordinary session were reviewed, discussed and approved, most notably;

- Regional Review of the Second Cairo Declaration 2013.
- Participation in the 56th session of the United Nations Commission on Population and Development.
- Ratification of observing Arab Day for Population and Development.



Participation in a virtual workshop on the sixth review of the Programme of Action / Conference on Population and Development in the Arab Region / 10 years after the Cairo Declaration of 2013

The Higher Population Council participated in a virtual workshop on the sixth review of the Programme of Action / Conference on Population and Development in the Arab Region / 10 Years after the Cairo Declaration of 2013 on 26/10/2022. The workshop was organized by ESCWA, the League of Arab States and the United Nations Population Fund via visual communication technology. During the workshop, the audit report form was reviewed and discussed, forwarded to the Arab countries to be filled out, adopted and used in preparation of the national report and the final Arab report.

This review seeks out to monitor the progress made over the past five years and highlight trends, developments, weaknesses and strengths in the formulation and implementation of population policies and programs, the common challenges faced by arab countries in fulfilling their commitments, as well as the opportunities and positive factors that contributed to the success of major efforts in this area. It is expected that this review, as in previous ones, will result in a regional report to be submitted to the fifty-seventh session of the United Nations Commission on Population and Development to be held in New York in April 2024.

Meeting with the Ministry of Planning / Iraq to exchange experiences on population and development alissues

The Higher Population Council held a meeting with stakeholders at the Ministry of Planning/ Iraq on 24/4/2022, with the purpose of exchanging knowledge and experiences on issues relevant to population and development, in a way that contributes to upgrading and enhancing capabilities and efficiency in supporting population and development issues, and developing qualitative and target programs and initiatives to support these issues and attaining the welfare of Arab societies. This meeting comes within the framework of the Council's endeavor to achieve one of the objectives of the Arab Council for Population and Development related to the exchange of experiences among Arab countries, based on Resolution No. (13) issued by the Arab Council on its third session on coordination and exchange of experiences between the Arab States members of the Arab Council for Population and Development and the State of Iraq.


Participation in the 55th session of the UN Commission on Population and Development, New York

The Higher Population Council participated in the 55th session of the UN Commission on Population and Development, held remotely in New York from 25-29/4/2022. The session addressed 'Population and sustainable development issues, especially holistic and continued economic growth for all.'

On behalf of Jordan, HPC presented as part of the main meeting a paper on Jordan's position on population and sustainable development, sustainable and inclusive economic growth which stated that Jordan adopts the Sustainable Development Goals and the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development as a framework for its policies and programmes, and submits its voluntary reports on the progress it has made towards attaining the objectives of these goals, as it recognizes the need to adhere to the complementary interrelationship between population trends and sustainable development.

Institutional Level: National Capacity-Building in Population and Development



Scientific Meeting on the Role of Pharmacists in Reproductive Planning Services in Jordan

The Higher Population Council, in cooperation with the Jordan Pharmacists Syndicate and the support of Share-Net International organized a scientific assembly on the role of pharmacists in reproductive planning services in Jordan on 13/12/2022, with the participation of a number of pharmacists registered in the



Pharmacists Syndicate from different governorates.

This meeting came into being to strengthen the partnership between the public and private sectors in reproductive health services, especially in fulfilling the desires of couples where childbirth planning is concerned. The meeting also aimed to find participatory ways to enhance the role of pharmacists in the reproductive planning program in Jordan and increase the role of pharmaceutical counseling in this regard.

Consultative Meeting on the Expected Role of Administrative Records

Higher Population Council held a consultative meeting on the anticipated role of administrative records on 21/12/2022, which brought together the main sources of administrative data in the statistical system in Jordan. The meeting intended to more comprehensive understanding of the data products of the current situation of administrative data and the



gaps at the national and institutional levels, and to identify the types of statistics, aspects of data uses, and the challenges and difficulties facing institutions and ministries. The workshop came out with a comprehensive report of the event, which were then forwarded to the participating institutions, as they contained the proposals that the participating institutions will adopt as they prepare their annual statistical report for the year 2022.

Workshop on Sharing Experiences on Integrating the Population and Gender Dimension in Municipal Plans

The Higher Population Council, in cooperation with the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), held a workshop to exchange experiences on integrating the population dimension and gender into municipal plans 9-10/12-2022. Participating in the workshop were heads of municipalities, and directors of development



units in the selected municipalities, namely (Greater Salt Municipality, Al-Ardah, Greater Jerash Municipality, Um Al-Jimal Municipality, Greater Ma'an Municipality, Greater Tafila Municipality Al Quera Municipality and Ayye / Kerak Municipality.

This workshop came as the concluding step of the project to integrate the population dimension and gender into municipal plans, which also included follow-up visits to the selected municipalities to determine the extent of their integration into these plans.

The main objectives of the workshop were to exchange experiences and provide participants with practical skills to integrate the population dimension and gender into the plans of their municipalities, and link them to the goals of sustainable development and the commitments of the Conference on Population and Development, Cairo 1994, so that all will enjoy a fair and equal share of services in their communities.

Capacity building program of charities / societies to apply national standards for youthfriendly reproductive and sexual health services in cooperation with the Institute of Family Health Care / King Hussein Foundation.

The program aimed to introduce personnel in charitable societies (Arhaba / Irbid, Deir Youssef / Irbid, Al-Manara Charity for Social Development / Amman, Women's Union for World Peace – Russeifa: Power and Resolve for People with Disabilities) to national standards to provide

youth-friendly sexual and reproductive health services, taking into account the sensitivity of the local culture and religious values, and establish necessary mechanisms for the application of the standards at the concerned associations, and future steps to provide an appropriate package of sexual and reproductive health services and information.

A training workshop was held for the integration and capacity building of faculty members in selected universities (Jordan, Science and Technology, Petra, Al Hashemiyyeh) and personnel in university clinics to apply national standards for youth-friendly reproductive and sexual health services in cooperation with the Royal Health Awareness Society.

Workshops on the application of the participatory approach in the transfer and use of knowledge at the local and international levels

The Higher Population Council, and Share-Net Jordan, funded by Share-Net International held three workshops on the application of the participatory approach in the transfer and use of knowledge at the local and international levels on parent-child relationship with regard to sexual and reproductive health information.



The First workshop was held on 24/3/2022, with the participation of a number of relevant national institutions from different sectors, and aimed to adopt a participatory approach to transfer and use the acquired knowledge on parent-child relation with regard to sexual and reproductive health information to partners, through a better understanding, which helps the transfer of knowledge, and facilitate the learning process through a participatory approach and exchange of experiences gained with partners.

The Second workshop was held on 26/6/2022, with the participation of a committee of local experts and the target group of the first workshop, and aimed to transfer and use the acquired

knowledge to partners, and approve the preparation of knowledge products that enable parents educate their children on sexual and reproductive health, and encourage rapport between them.

The Third workshop was held on 30/11/2022, with the participation of the same group from the previous two workshops, with the aim of continuing the transfer of acquired knowledge on parent-child relation on sexual and reproductive health to partners, and discussing the technical settings for the preparation of knowledge products that examine parent-child relation on sexual and reproductive health information.

A training course for media professionals: Practical applications to employ the media in supporting demographic and developmental issues

The Higher Population Council, in cooperation with the United Nations Population Fund, held a training course for a group of media professionals and advocates of demographic and development issues from various media outlets 16-17/10/2022. The course aimed to enhance the efficiency and capabilities of



media professionals on ways to employ modern creative media arts with in their work, discuss materials prepared by media professionals, review achievements, challenges and defects in materials, and the role it plays in raising the awareness amongst community members and gaining the support of decision-makers.

Training workshop on mechanisms to calculate the cost of economic abuse against women

HPC participated in a training workshop on mechanisms to calculate the cost of economic abuse against women. The workshop was organized by the National Committee for Women, ESCWA, the United Nations Population Fund and the Department of Statistics. On the whole, the workshop aimed to prepare a team capable of reading the results of the survey in Jordan, conduct statistical analysis, complete the necessary mathematical equations and prepare reports.

Lecture for media professionals at the Jordan News Agency / Petra

HPC gave a lecture to media professionals of the Jordan News Agency-Petra, 7/12/2022 on current demographic status in Jordan, the responsibilities and programs of HPC, a review on the electronic knowledge platform for reproductive health "Darby", and ran a contest on population matters.



Training Workshop on Neuro-Linguistic Programming NLP

HPC held a training of trainers workshop on sexual and reproductive health and reproductive rights, on neuro-linguistic programming (NLP, communication) training, 11-15/9/2022.

The course aimed to train participants on communication skills, training techniques and guidance, and to address the concept of NLP, and enable participants to use NLP methodology, models and interventions.

Training of Trainers Course on Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights

HPC held a training of trainers course on sexual and reproductive health and reproductive rights as part of the project towards more sustainable services and solutions for sexual and reproductive health needs of youth and refugees in Jordan, which was carried out in partnership with VRIJE University / Amsterdam, the Dutch Belink Academy, the Royal Dutch Tropical Institute KIT, Yarmouk University and Ahl Al Jabal Society, Jordan.

The objectives of the project were to design a unified constructive approach founded on international criteria to bring about coordinate efforts in a more structured manner to address sexual and reproductive health issues effectively and efficiently with special emphasis on the most vulnerable communities in Jordan, and to improve collaboration among key stakeholders.

Implementation of the second phase of the project to empower Syrian refugee women in Jordan

The Higher Population Council finalized the activities of the second phase of the project to empower Syrian refugee women in Jordan, which aimed to empower a number of Syrian refugee women and girls in Jordan to enable them earn a decent living, develop their professional and cognitive capabilities, contribute to the empowerment of women and girls benefiting from the project, and improve personal capabilities of beneficiaries.

The project was completed in all regions of the Kingdom by the Higher Population Council and the Islamic Centers Association, funded by the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia through the Saudi Fund for Development. Its implementation and achievement of results were supervised by the Center of Arab Women for Training and Research (CAWTAR).

Share-Net Jordan participated in the launch of the Youth International Practitioner Committee iCoP which was organized by Share-Net International with the participation of regional centers in Jordan, the Netherlands, Burkina Faso, Bangladesh, Burundi, Colombia and Ethiopia. During the ceremony, there was a presentation on the integration of youth in Share-Net Jordan in all dimensions.



Meeting to Establish a Committee of Youth Practitioners on Sexual and Reproductive Health and Reproductive Rights Issues

Share-Net Jordan held the first meeting for the foundation of a youth practitioners committee in cooperation with Youth for Health Network at the Royal Health Awareness Society, via visual communication technology on 27/12/2022. The committee was established to hold open discussions and dialogue on sexual and reproductive health issues and reproductive rights. During the meeting, Share-Net Jordan was introduced, its vision, responsibilities and objectives made clear as well as clarifying what was expected from the practitioners committees with a focus on a certain issue of sexual and reproductive health and reproductive rights.

Participation in the second training workshop on the process of introducing Share-Net Jordan plan on the International Aid and Transparency Agency, IATI system

The Higher Population Council and Share-Net Jordan participated in the second training workshop on the process of introducing the Share-Net Jordan plan to the (IATI) system, on 10/3/2022. The training workshop, structure your activities in IATI, held via zoom, was organized by Share-Net International.

HPC again participated in the third training workshop, setting up partner lines & finances in the same field on 22 / 3 / 2022.


The first workshop, 8 / 2 / 2022, for coordinators of the knowledge platforms with Share-Net International was also conducted via Zoom.

Share-Net International team visits Jordan

ways to exchange knowledge and thoughts within the framework of cooperation between Share-Net Jordan and Share-Net International, in addition to a review of the communication strategy on sexual and reproductive health issues (2022-2024).

HPC Secretary-General Prof. Dr. Issa Al-Masarweh, gave a lecture on 'Population Policy in Jordan and its Relationship to Jordanian National Security,' at the Royal Jordanian National Defense College on 26/10/2022. Students enrolled in the Defense Course attended the meeting in the presence of chairman and members of the steering board.



The Higher Population Council launched the electronic knowledge platform for reproductive health for youth 'DARBY' on 19/10/2022 with the participation of the relevant national authorities. The platform, established by HPC and the support of the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), aims to raise awareness among community members, especially young men and women, and raise and improve their reproductive health through offering an integrated package





of information and data to enable them take the correct decisions regarding their reproductive health.

The platform is a major source to give out data and information on reproductive health in an attractive and creative manner that appeals to young men and women and to all sectors of society as well. The platform also gives the opportunity for visitors to address questions on topics relevant to reproductive health, where they are looked into by a committee of competent experts, and answers are then relayed to the person in question in complete confidentiality and privacy.

As part of the platform's advocacy campaign, and with the support of Share-Net International, multiple introductory and awareness gatherings were held for university students of Al Yarmouk, Hashemite, Al Bayt, Jordan University, Al Zaytouna universities and Princess Muna College of Nursing / Royal Medical Services, during the period between 14/11 - 27/12/2022.

During the meetings, presentations were made about the platform and its components, and a competition was held for students on the content of the platform and various demographic and developmental concerns.






Number of visitors to HPC website in 2022, 6,333 visitors (m/f)




Number of new visitors to HPC website in 2022, 6,042 visitors (m/f)




Percentage of visitors to HPC website during 2022 by age groups



Percentage of visitors to HPC website during 2022 by countries




Comparison of the number of website visitors, social networks and the Knowledge Platform Share-net 2021 & 2022




Number of new visitors in 2022, 481 visitors (m/f) Share-Net




Percentage of visitors to the Knowledge Platform-Share-Net Jordan during 2022 (by age group)






■ The institutional performance monitoring and evaluation system is activated and put into effect; it aims to:


